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# Committee Background

# Topic Background



After the Rebellion, there were calls for the "complete annihilation" of Capitol citizens. The interim government of Panem opposed this idea, not on moral grounds, but in order to maintain a sustainable population. District 13's President Alma Coin, also the interim head of state for the whole country, put forward a proposal.

The proposal was that the children of the Capitol's highest officials should be reaped to participate in one "final, symbolic Hunger Games." Known as the 76th hunger games. If approved, the new Games would be announced with the support of the victors, but votes would remain anonymous for their own security.



# General History



#### **The Formation of Panem**

#### **Dark Days**

The Dark Days is a term commonly used to describe the collapse of the First Rebellion in Panem, which occurred 74 years prior to the beginning of the series.

#### Tribute

2 inhabitants of the 12 districts chosen to be forced to participate in the game's annuals created by the capitol.

#### Districts

They are nation-states, each district is responsible for producing, acquiring, and perfecting goods in a particular industry dictated by the Capitol.

#### Capitol

The federal government, the city where the most powerful citizens live, each year forces the districts to choose two tributes to face each other in the hunger games.

#### Rebels

It refers to individuals who challenge the authority of the Capitol, either by verbal dissent or armed insurrection.

#### Peacekeeper

They are the military force controlled by the Capitol and are responsible for maintaining law and order through the nation of Panem.

#### Avox

They are people who have committed a crime, and their tongues are cut out so that they cannot speak.

#### Victors

Victors are tributes who have won previous Hunger Games.

#### Victors Village

The Victors' Village is a wealthy neighborhood in every district where past victors of the Hunger Games reside.

#### Arena

An arena is a large, enclosed, outdoor area where the Hunger Games were held each year.

#### Cornucopia

giant horn, whose interior is provided with a large amount of supplies - clothing, sleeping bags, weapons, water, food, medicine, among others - all of which are decisive elements to survive the games; Owning them makes the difference between life and death

#### Reaper

Reaper is the male tribute from District 11.

#### Reaping

A reaping is an annual event that takes place in every district before each Hunger Games, where the tributes of the upcoming Games are chosen.

#### Mentor

He is the person in charge of preparing and training each of the tributes to survive in the games, he is the one who teaches combat strategies and how to obtain the favor of the sponsors.

#### Mockingjay

The mockingjay is a bird that was created through the unintended mating of mockingbirds and jabberjays.

#### **Careers tribute/ district**

Were tributes who trained throughout their life to compete in the Hunger Games.

#### Rebelion

Was a major civil war in Panem which lasted three years, ending seventy-four years before the beginning of The Hunger Games trilogy.

#### Game maker

They are people from the Capitol who design and plan the Hunger Games each year and control the arena during the Games.

#### **Force field**

They are invisible electric fields set up by the Capitol that are used to prevent tributes from escaping the arena and any other places so they won't run away from the Games.

#### Victor's tour

It is an annual occasion when the Capitol required the most recent victor to travel across Panem with their mentor, escort, prep team, and stylist.

#### Second rebellion bombing

The Second Rebellion was a major civil war in Panem which began approximately seventy-five years after the conclusion of the First Rebellion. The conflict pitted Panem's totalitarian regime, led by President Coriolanus Snow, against the disparate rebel forces of the twelve outlying districts, supported and nominally led militarily by the forces of the independent District 13, headed by President Alma Coin.
